Traffic management charges

Effective traffic management is essential during our operations to ensure everyone's safety and minimise disruptions. Below are the reasons we charge for traffic management and how we comply with Auckland Transport (AT) guidelines.

1. Compliance with AT Guidelines

We follow the Code of Practice for Temporary Traffic Management (CoPTTM) and the New Zealand Guide to Temporary Traffic Management (NZGTTM)

- **2. Safety** Proper traffic management reduces the risk of accidents and injuries
- 3. Minimising disruption It helps keep traffic delays to a minimum
- **4. Specialised equipment and personnel** Traffic management requires specialised equipment and trained personnel

Meeting Auckland Transport standards and guidelines

- Site specific traffic management plans (SSTMPs) Required for activities that significantly impact traffic flow or pedestrian safety
- **Chargeable generics** Pre-approved designs from AT used for external traffic management
- Standard generics For less complex projects, our crews can complete the set-up themselves without additional charges

Levels of traffic management

• Level 1

Low-impact activities managed with basic traffic control measures like cones and signs.

• Level 2

Medium-impact activities requiring more advanced traffic control measures, such as temporary traffic signals or lane closures.

• Level 3

High-impact activities requiring extensive traffic management plans, including road closures and detours.

Each level requires a specific Traffic Management Plan (TMP) to ensure safety and compliance with CoPTTM and NZGTTM standards.



Frequently Asked Questions

Can I provide my own traffic management or reinstatement to reduce costs?

Yes, you can provide your own traffic management or reinstatement if it meets the required standards. We can remove these fees once Fulton Hogan confirm that your approved traffic management plan is sufficient for their scope of works. Reinstatement must be completed to Auckland Transport's standard. Let us know if you would like to discuss these options.

What is a Traffic Management Plan (TMP)?

A TMP details how activities in the road corridor will be carried out to minimise inconvenience and ensure safety.

Can I apply for a refund if the initial quoted TMP was not required?
